

**Sakiko Fukuda-Parr**  
**Brief bio (2016)**

Sakiko Fukuda-Parr is Professor of International Affairs at The New School in New York. She is a development economist interested in human development and human rights approaches. Her recent publications include *Fulfilling Social and Economic Rights* (with T. Lawson-Remer and S. Randolph, OUP 2015) which received the 2016 Best Book in Human Rights Scholarship Award of the American Political Science Association; *MDGs, Capabilities and Human Rights: The Power of Numbers to Shape Agendas* (coedited with A. Yamin, Routledge. 2015); *Human Rights and the Capabilities Approach: An Interdisciplinary Conversation* (co-edited with Diane Elson and Polly Vizard; 2011) and *Food Security in South Africa: Human Rights and Entitlement Perspectives* (co-edited with Vivienne Taylor, UCT Press 2015). She was the founding editor of the *Journal of Human Development and Capabilities*.

From 1995 to 2004, she was lead author and director of the UNDP *Human Development Reports*. She has also had appointments as: Associate Dean for Academic Affairs of The Milano School at The New School; Visiting Professor at The University of Cape Town; and Research Fellow at The Belfer Center, Kennedy School, Harvard University.

Earlier, she worked at the World Bank on agriculture in the Middle East and at UNDP on aid coordination and reforming technical assistance.

She serves on a number of boards and advisory committees including: UN Committee on Development Policy as Vice Chair; the UN Secretary General's High Level Panel on Access to Medicines; the Lancet-Oslo Commission on Global Governance for Health; the Board of the International Association for Feminist Economics; and the Board of the award winning NGO Knowledge Ecology International.
